Muckland Bridge Club NEW ZEAL NORTH ISLAND TEAMS BRID



Auckland-Northland in conjunction with Auckland Bridge Club are proud to have hosted the annual North Island Teams. Attracting a total of 28 teams, the winning team comprised of three Aucklanders in **Patrick Carter, Julie Atkinson, Zachary Yan,** and **Jack James**. Patrick and Julie, in particular, dominated the pair datums – bringing back an average of 1.55 IMPs per board.

The ATKINSON team's only loss was to runners up Blair Fisher, Elizabeth Fisher, Tom Jacob, and Steph Jacob, narrowly losing by 5 IMPs. Who said that overtricks don't matter at Teams?

Team **ATKINSON** finished with 113.82 VPs out of a total possible 160. Silver and bronze were a closer competition. Team **Fisher** came away with a 7-0-1 record and 103.36 VPs, yet the difference might have been as small as an IMP or two: Team **ZHU** (Julia Zhu, June Lei, George Sun, and Alice Young) finished on 103.27, with a match record of 6-0-2.

Congratulations to our regional champions in the Loveblock Wines-sponsored New Zealand Wide Pairs, held on October 17th. A total of 818 pairs competed from across the country. Felicity and Bob delivered an outstanding performance, scoring 69.02% and placing 4th nationwide. Diana/Jolene and Barbara/Neil also shone with 66.51% and 65.60%, finishing 13th and 16th overall.

A special mention goes to Diana, Jolene, and Neil, all Intermediate players, and to Barbara Lockyer, a Junior player—an impressive achievement to reach the top 2% in such a strong field featuring many leading Open players.

WORLD STAGE SUCCESS



It was a huge effort — and a fantastic achievement — for the New Zealand–Australian team **WHAM** to defeat a top Russian team in the final of the **22**nd **HCL International Bridge Championship**, repeating last year's success.

The team included Michael Whibley and Matthew Brown, both current members of the New Zealand Open Team. Michael is now based in Argentina, while Matthew — who learned his early bridge in Whangārei — has since played from Auckland and now lives in England with his wife Andi Boughey, herself a New Zealand Women's representative. Proud mother Tania Brown is our regional treasurer – a family deeply entwined with bridge!

Their Australia-based teammates rounded out a strong international lineup, and the team's outstanding performance earned them an impressive \$86,000 in prize money.

KERIKERI QUAIL RIDGE SWISS PAIRS

Richard, a long-time tutor at the Whangārei Bridge Club, had a special reason to celebrate recently. His student, Alan — who first learned bridge several years ago in Auckland — returned to the game in 2021 and joined Richard's lessons to refresh his skills.

Richard and Alan totalled 96.34 VPs out of a possible 120 over six rounds of competition, finishing well above 2nd place Bill Humphrey and Patsy Walters, who scored 82.45 VPs.

The pair's first tournament win together was warmly received by the players. As an Intermediate player, Alan did exceptionally well to hold his own against strong competition and help secure victory in the 5A event — a fantastic achievement for both tutor and student!

Phangārei ASHBURY HEIGHTS PAIRS TOURNAMENT

Whangārei Bridge Club's brand-new tournament, sponsored by **Ashbury Heights Lifestyle Village** drew 25 tables spread across three graded sections.

Jerry and Andrew had a steady — and altogether outstanding — day in the Open, scoring 66.85% in the morning and following it up with 64.81% in the afternoon. Their consistent play saw them finish comfortably ahead of runners-up Ian Berrington and Fuxia Wen by more than 5%.

Dave and Nancy made a strong start in the Intermediate field with a fantastic 68.52%. The afternoon proved tougher at 47.45%, but their earlier success held firm — they narrowly claimed first place with an overall 57.99%, just 0.35% ahead of Juliet Golightly and Vanessa McGoldrick on 57.64%.

Sue and Liz, in the Junior section, were unstoppable from the start, recording a stunning 72.25% in the morning — the highest score of the day across all sections! They backed it up with 65.42% in the afternoon to win their grade by a wide margin. Their average score was a full 13% ahead of runners-up Jillian Kearney and Ron Bywater, whose 56.00% earned a well-deserved silver

Although the South hand isn't the most traditional preempt, one can't really be faulted for opening with a 6card spade suit and good shape. North faces quite the powerhouse.

With AK of partner's suit, perhaps suspecting that South thus had something on the side to open, would no doubt be pleasantly surprised to hear of an ace. Slam isn't a certainty from there, but with a good source of tricks and no quick losers, North ends up being well rewarded for going a "bit further".
