Compass Scoring – Support and Development

The WBRC is very keen to promote and support the Clubs in our region. Most of our Clubs are using the Compass scoring system, and the WBRC has identified a need for the training of new scorers and for the support of our existing scorers.

Mike Neels from Cambridge has volunteered to prepare and present a series of on-line lessons on the use of Compass, starting with

- 1. Setting up the program in your Club for the start of the new year, and
- 2. Preparation and distribution of members' Subscription Invoices

As these are topics that all Clubs will be instigating shortly these lessons will begin very soon. At the end of each lesson participants will be able to ask questions which Mike will answer. The lessons will be recorded and then will be available on-line as part of a library of scoring resources. We will be asking for your suggestions on the topics for future lessons. A Waikato Bays Compass Scorers Group has been set up on WhatsApp, and we hope that it will operate in a similar fashion to our very popular Waikato Bays Directors Forum.
