SUCCESS IN TASMANIA

New Zealand pairs put up an excellent performance in the Tasmanian Festival of Bridge. Two Aucklanders were at the top of the Australian Mixed Swiss Pairs, with **Ashley Bach** & Arlene Dalley and Hugh McGann & **Candice Smith** taking out both 1st and 2nd, with Ashley and Arlene also taking the silver medal in the Australian Open Swiss Pairs.



AUCKLAND'S INTERNATIONALS

Although happening 400km apart, the two Teams events of 22nd March were both won by Aucklanders.

Up in Whangarei, the **100% Barrells Open Teams** were won by Team BADLEY (**Ian Berrington**, **Fuxia Wen**, **Paula Boughey**, and **Duncan Badley**) who brought home a convincing victory in the 16-team event, winning all 6 matches of the competition and finishing with a comfortable 10 VP lead.





In Rotorua's **Kelly Peirse Memorial Teams**, Team FRASER-HOSKIN (**Zachary Yan**, **Jeremy Fraser-Hoskin**, **Lysandra Zheng**, and **Tim Pan**) hovered between 2nd and 6th in the 24-team field until a 20 VP win in the final round allowed them to overtake Team PELKMAN and win the event by a much less comfortable 10 VPs.

All four pairs will be attending the APBF Championships in Hefei, China this May. Team FRASER-HOSKIN are 2/3 pairs in the Open, with Ian Berrington and Fuxia Wen playing in the Mixed, and Paula Boughey and Duncan Badley as the reserve pair for the Seniors.

Out and About JANE'S JOURNEY

Hibiscus Bridge Club

First up: a visit to Hibiscus Coast Bridge Club.



A beautiful setting in Edith Hopper Park, these clubrooms are a real stunner! Meeting with Club President Robert Chidlow and several members of a hard-working team, we had a helpful exchange of ideas with an outline plan of actions for the committee.

2 Papatoetoe Bridge Club

Next stop was Papatoetoe Bridge Club for a meeting with President Mark Buckley and tutor Lance Bowden, listening to the challenges the club faces in its recruitment.



The demographic of the area surrounding the club has changed over the years and bringing new people to the game is an area they most need support with. Although a relatively small club, they have some of the biggest participation rates, with the numbers of their members taking part in sessions and tournaments extremely high.

The club, with others, have been focusing on their constitution and going through all the steps necessary to meet the new Incorporated Society Act requirements. They have had added work as they are also a charity. They spoke also of their 'Ultra-Restricted' tournaments, as did Papakura and Franklin, which together with Howick provide support to novice players. These gentle introductions to a tournament format are proving a popular initiative, introducing players to travelling to other clubs to play.

Papakura Bridge Club

The next stop was Papakura Bridge Club.

I met with their secretary Barbara Stretton, tutor Claire Gunn and several enthusiastic committee members.

This year they had used the NZB social media campaign for lesson advertising and felt it had worked extremely well.

Claire told me she had 22 new students which was the largest intake in



a long time. We talked about possible retention methods and how they manage that important transition stage from lesson into play. I will be sending them some of the ideas we discussed and shared.

Franklin Bridge Club

The last stop was Franklin Bridge Club.

I met with Club Captain Terry Evans, tutor Maureen Nelson, and a very enthusiastic group from their committee.

Their clubrooms have a very prominent position in the heart of the town and their signage on the busy road front is a real asset to them. I admired their flier campaign from last year and learned that they were pleased with numbers from their NZB social media campaign this year.





14 had come to the first lesson with a further 4 expected in the second week. One challenge is to ensure the intake matches those leaving the club.

Although not keen to have too big a class, they recognise that if 19 members are taken off the register each year, they need 19 to be retained to simply stay even, and that may take 30-35 students to be achievable. Ideas were shared and I'm sending notes of our discussions through to the club.



Jane hopes to visit both clubs on Waiheke Island, Howick, Waitemata, Warkworth and Mangawhai later in the year.

DO YOU KNOW YOUR LAWS?

Even just as a player, it's good to be prepared and know what happens when things go wrong.

You've probably seen it before: you win the auction, and to your surprise, your RHO leads a card. You check, and they're not on lead.

As the declarer, what are your options?

Need some help?

Take a look at Caroline Wiggins' handy <u>visual guide</u>, or watch Ed Roggeveen's in-depth <u>YouTube presentations</u>

When the opponents make a mistake like this, you're allowed to **accept** it. If you do, *either*:

- Partner puts down dummy, but the trick starts from RHO, or
- You put your own hand down as dummy, and partner declares

And if you **don't accept**, the lead returns to your LHO. Now the mistaken lead is a **penalty card**.

Again, you have several options. Either:

- Impose no restrictions, but the card stays on the table and must be played when possible, or
- Require or prohibit* the lead of the suit, in which case the penalty card is picked up

*If you prohibit a lead, the effect lasts as long as the correct opening leader stays on lead.

INCORPORATED SOCIETIES ACT UPDATE

A reminder to all of our clubs that the clock is now ticking on reregistering under the new Incorporated Societies Act.

This is not a five-minute task.

There are processes to work through, including a review of your **club constitution**.

If you are an incorporated society and have not started this piece of work for your club - please start today.

If your club does nothing: from 5 April 2026 it will cease to exist.

Well done to all our region's clubs that have this "done and dusted".
