HESITATIONS – WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Have you ever been waiting an abnormally long time for your partner to bid, with your own bid prepared long in advance – only for your opponents to frown and say "you can't do that: your partner waited too long to bid".

It's a common misconception that you *can't* bid if your partner hesitates. But when your partner hesitates, it communicates something to you outside of what you're allowed to know. You can't decide that a fast bid shows a weak hand and a slow bid shows a strong hand! When you or your partner hesitate, the Director must consider whether unauthorized information exists.

Suppose again that your partner hesitates. Now, you had several plausible choices of call when it comes to your turn. You're not barred from bidding – but you're barred from making a call that **could have been suggested by the hesitation**.

Sometimes this means the Director will poll other players on their choice of bid without the hesitation. If the call you chose is overwhelmingly popular nothing will change. If you've made a minority call – potentially being affected by the hesitation – the Laws require an adjustment.

EXAMPLE: You made an **ace-asking bid**, holding one yourself. Your partner also shows you one ace. However, you know you have a long running suit – so on the wrong lead, slam can make. **You gamble and bid the slam**. Partner surprises you with a void in another suit – so you never had two losers to start with. A fortuitous top board for you.

Now, what if your partner **hesitated** for a long while before showing you one ace? What could they have on their mind? Maybe they've just forgotten system, but more likely they've got a tough decision on whether or not to show their void as an "ace". Even if you were thinking exactly the same way as in the first scenario, the Laws require an adjustment – because you made a bid that *could have been* influenced by the hesitation, regardless of whether it actually was. - The introduction of **further ranks** above Emerald,
- The adjustment of gaps between ranks, which are not consistent, and
- How ranks might affect eligibility for graded tournaments. In particular should a player with <50 A points, with rank of Local Master and therefore intermediate in grade and with 20+ stars be eligible for intermediate tournaments?

NZ Bridge is asking for **feedback** on the rankings system and in particular answers to the three points noted above. Please provide submissions to **john.skipper@nzbridge.co.nz** by **10 August 2025**.

Once submissions have been considered, a **draft proposal** will be published before a final recommendation is made to the Board of NZ Bridge, hopefully by the **end of August 2025**.

Discussion Paper: Masterpoint Ranks and Grades

NZ Bridge manages a player incentive scheme where masterpoints are awarded for success in club sessions through to national tournaments. The requirements for each grade are detailed in the appendix below, which is copied from the NZ Bridge website.

Recent changes have seen the introduction of two new grades, the Platinum and Emerald grades.

Questions have been asked about:

- the introduction of further ranks above Emerald,
- the adjustment of gaps between ranks, which are not consistent, and
- how ranks might affect eligibility for graded tournaments. In particular should a player with <50 A points, with rank of Local Master and therefore intermediate in grade and with 20+ stars be eligible for intermediate tournaments?

NZ Bridge is asking for feedback on the rankings system and in particular answers to the three points noted above. Please provide submissions to john.skipper@nzbridge.co.nz by 10 August 2025.

Once submissions have been considered, a draft proposal will be published before a final recommendation is made to the Board of NZ Bridge, hopefully by the end of August 2025.





Appendix 1: Current Rankings from the NZ Bridge website. There are twelve ranks accorded to holders of Master Points

Rank	Aggregate of A & B Points	When stars are added
Certificate of Proficiency	5	NA
Club Master	20	NA
Local Master	50	1* = 100 to 149, 2* = 150 to 199 etc
Provincial Master	100 (including at least 50 A Points)	1* = 200 to 299, 2* = 300 to 399 etc
Master	200 (including at least 100 A Points)	1* = 400 to 599, 2* = 600 to 799 etc
National Master	350 (including at least 175 A Points)	1* = 700 to 1049, 2* = 1050 to 1400 etc
Life Master	500 (including at least 250 A Points)	1* = 1000 to 1499, 2* = 1500 to 1999 etc
Grand Master	1000 (including at least 500 A Points)	1* = 2000 to 3999, 2* = 4000 to 5999 etc
Silver Grand Master	2500 (including at least 1250 A Points)	1* = 5000 to 7499, 2* = 7500 to 9999 etc
Gold Grand Master	4000 (including at least 2500 A Points)	1* = 8000 to 11999, 2* = 12000 to 15999 etc
Emerald Grand Master	8,000 (including at least 6,000 A Points)	
Platinum Grand Master	10,000 (including at least 7,500 A Points)

New Guidelines for Tournament Scheduling

A project team comprising NZ Bridge Board members and representatives from the regions met for a two-day workshop to review the rules around scheduling and running tournaments.

The team reviewed pages C3 to C8 inclusive from the NZ Bridge Manual. Attached is the approved update.

The most important change relates to allowing much more flexibility to Clubs to manage their own tournaments through their Regional Committees.

Tournaments are loaded into the annual schedule by the Tournament Scheduler as confirmed events. It is up to the Regional Committees to make changes and tell the Tournament Scheduler what to change.

Clubs may amend, cancel or add tournaments subject to Regional Committee approval. Regions have autonomy to make changes to the tournament schedule subject to some basic rules related to distance from other events on at the same time. Existing events in the schedule have precedence. Most restrictions apply to A point events.

The number of events that a club or region can hold is not limited.

Metro events contested in person are supported. Online B point level events are supported but limited to daytime hours (midweek only).

Online

Online Club tournaments may not be run on weekends where any other tournaments are being held. From 2026 up to three weekends a year will be set aside for online tournaments with any Club able to run one on that weekend. For 2025 the weekend of the 21st/22nd December has been set aside for online. No face-to-face tournaments may be scheduled on that weekend and there is no limit on Clubs scheduling online tournaments. Such events need to meet the tournament regulations.

This online policy will be reviewed in twelve months or earlier.

Midweek tournaments may be online or in person, with online events limited to daytime only.

These new processes can commence immediately but subject to each region advising the name and contact details of their tournament co-ordinator.
